- Worksheets can be printed from the Habitat Tracker© software application. One each of most of the worksheets is included in the student Workbook, as an example. If the students need more than one worksheet of a particular type, have them print additional worksheets from the Habitat Tracker© application. The Instructions 'Collecting Wildlife Data' in the Habitat Observations component of the Workbook describes how to print and use the Habitat Tracker© Worksheets.
- The name of the Data file prints on all Habitat Tracker© reports. When student's submit reports as indications of their progress with Habitat Tracker©, you will know which Data file was used as a source of the data for the report.
- We highly recommend that all classes, regardless of level, follow the directions for the first project, Creating a Habitat Journal. This journal becomes a tool for the students in realizing the benefits of a computerized database application, relative to a traditional, paper-based model.
